What was the benefit?

- An exercise without propagation difficulties
- Able to be timed to suit all regions
- No language difficulties
- A 'real' test of our ability to respond
- No misleading scenario



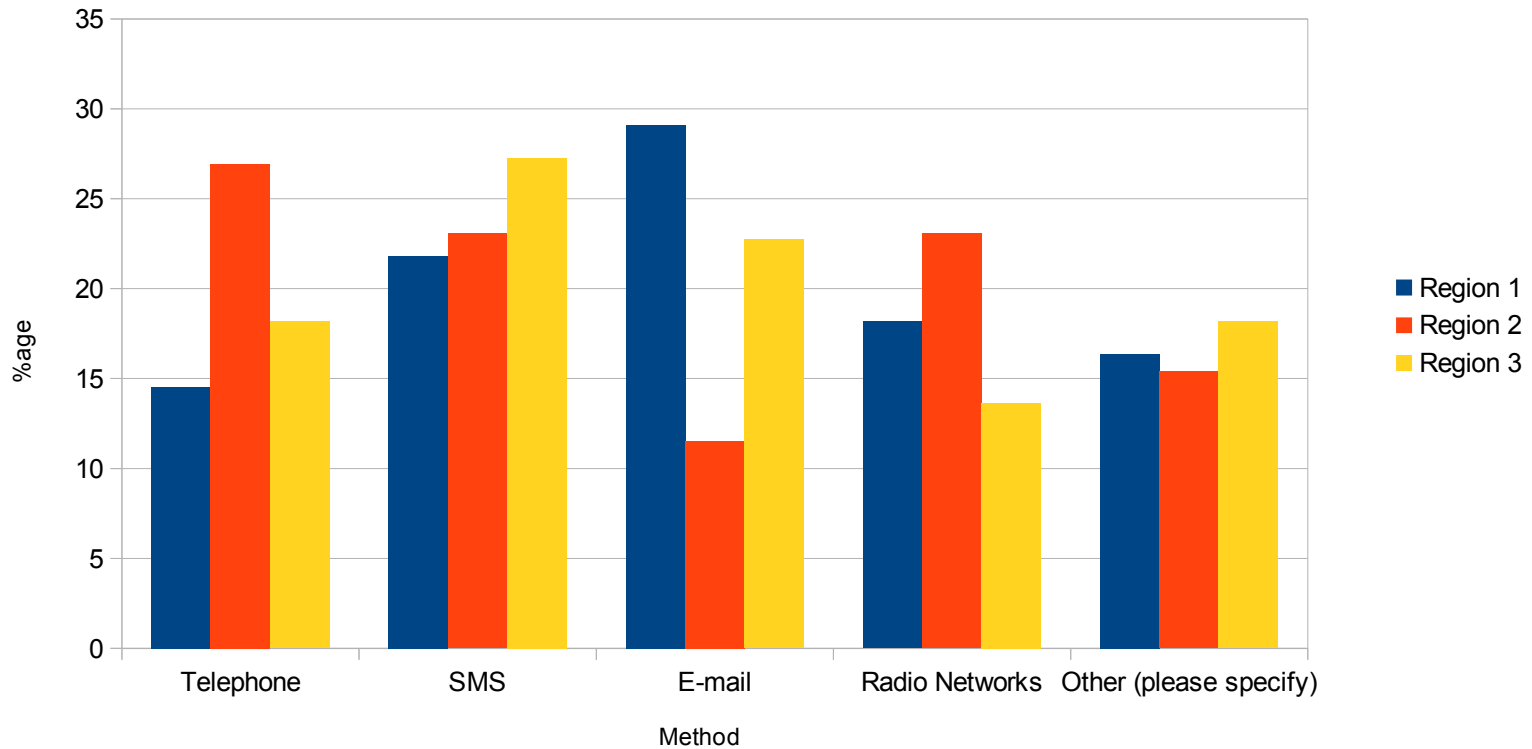
What did we learn from our Region?

- 22 of 39 countries that could have taken part responded to the call.
- Only three countries depended on a single means of alerting their members.
- 657 Radio Amateurs reported as available within one hour.
